A Special Place of Grace by Fr. John Stowe, O.F.M. Conv.

One Sunday evening, long after the buses of pilgrims had departed, I went for an evening walk to the Shrine Park. I was wearing a t-shirt from the Tepeyac Institute in El Paso, Texas, which is a bi-lingual theological and ministry training center for the laity where I was part of the faculty before coming to Carey.

As I passed the Basilica on my way back, a man sitting on a bench across from the church called out that he liked my t-shirt. When I indicated that I understood Spanish, he proceeded to explain to me the meaning of "Tepeyac," which is the hill in Mexico City where Our Lady appeared to the native Juan Diego in 1531. Of course, I know the story well, but was delighted to hear him tell the story and what an impact the Blessed Virgin Mary has in his life and the lives of the Mexican people.

This man, also named Juan, told me of a promise 17 years ago: that if he found work that allowed him to support his family in Toledo, he would come visit Our Lady of Consolation and give thanks every other week. The previous month marked the 17th year of visits every other Sunday evening. He comes around 9 p.m., when there aren't many people around, and gives thanks. When I met him, he was sitting outside with his dog while his wife went in to make her visit. I was deeply touched by Juan's story and the sincerity of his faith. This is just one of countless encounters with pilgrims who have had such powerful experiences of God's grace through Our Blessed Mother at this Shrine.

Just minutes before I sat down to write this, I met a family from Georgia that visits the Shrine

each year. The man, with his four-week-old daughter in his arms, introduced me to his eightyear-old son. He too made a promise: that he would bring his son here every year to receive Our Lady's blessing, until he turns 18.

Every one of these stories is a strong testimony to faith and the power of prayer. This is truly a special place of grace. Mary touches lives very deeply, and her pilgrims look forward to coming here again.

As I complete one year here at the Shrine, I am so grateful for the brief but intense encounters with so many people who have experienced God's healing power, and those who come with great faith along with their great needs. I have been delighted to experience the celebration of the Eucharist in Albanian, Chaldean, Korean, Polish, Tagalog, Spanish, Vietnamese, Italian, and Indian dialects here, and to sense a little of the universality of our Catholic faith through the various rites and cultural expressions that are all at home in Carey.

Please Help Us Be Good Stewards of Our Lady's Shrine



In the 1920's, Father Aloys Fish, the first Franciscan rector of the Shrine of Our Lady of Consolation, asked parishioners and pilgrims alike to make sacrifices in order to build a truly beautiful church in honor of Our Lady. They responded whole-heartedly. The magnificent Basilica we enjoy today, which has inspired so many, is the fruit of the sacrifices of those devoted Catholics 90 years ago. We have benefited from the sacrifices of that generation, and have enjoyed our magnificent Basilica for 85 years.

Periodically throughout the Shrine's history, various rectors have appealed to the generosity of pilgrims and parishioners to maintain and enhance the Shrine and its properties. The beautiful, modern Stations of the Cross, the lighting system, the pipe organ, and the Shrine Park altar have all been accomplished with the prayers and sacrificial gifts of those devoted to the Shrine. The stained-glass window restoration project, still nearing completion, is a recent example of the gifts of those who truly wish to glorify God and be good stewards of our beautiful Basilica. It is time to once again make an appeal to our already generous donors and to those who have not yet been a part of this magnificent project.

Offerings sent in and given by pilgrims just barely cover the expenses of basic operations at the Shrine of Our Lady of

Consolation. Larger projects, and even routine maintenance on our buildings, have depleted our savings and cash on hand. We have had to repair and replace sidewalks so that they are not hazardous to pedestrians. We want to restore the front steps of the Basilica. Several areas on the grounds are overdue for re-paving. The dome above the altar at the Shrine Park needs to be replaced. The Christ the King garden needs some work to look fresh and inviting once again. The windows in the Retreat House are not energy efficient, but we have not been able to replace them because of other needs that keep surfacing. New trees need to replace dying trees in the Shrine Park. These are just examples of what is needed to maintain

the facilities that we have and keep them in usable condition.

A much larger necessity is for an elevator in the Basilica, and for air-conditioning. These are enormous undertakings, but are essential to the future of the Shrine. Many of those who come to seek Mary's intercession have physical disabilities and have a difficult time with the stairs and with the heat in the summer. Pilgrims who have come here annually for 40 and 50 years would love to keep coming, but find it more difficult to do so. We cannot even begin to work on these major improvements until we address the immediate needs in front of us.

The colder months in Carey may not see as many buses arriving as during the pilgrimage season, but we stay busy with Teens Encounter Christ (TEC) and Kairos retreats. It is a real privilege to see so many high school students making their retreats at our retreat house on the grounds of the Shrine. They have many opportunities for prayer in the beautiful

Retreat groups have included the Men's Serenity, Opus Angelorum Sanctorum, and a Quilting Retreat. Regnum Christi had a family day. Indian Day in June brought pilgrims from Michigan and Ohio for the annual celebration of mass in the Syro-Malankara Rite. The Shrine was filled

with Filipino pilgrims on July 9, as it is each year on the second Saturday of July. We also welcomed Albanian and Korean pilgrims in numbers. More than 80 organized pilgrimages will visit the Shrine this season. The Seminarians from the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus came to the Shrine for a Day of Recollection on Labor Day, and the new school year brought new students for pilgrimages.
